SCOPE

The event, hosted at the Portuguese Pavilion on 24–25 September, positions Madeira as a global leader in innovative water and health solutions through its role as the first official EU Super Site Sentinel System member for wastewater surveillance. The hybrid format showcases how Madeira integrates advanced wastewater surveillance to safeguard public health, protect its tourism-driven economy, and contribute critical data to global health monitoring networks. The event highlights Madeira's practical application of wastewater surveillance, its role as a training hub for the EU Water Academy, and the launch of the Islands of Life Initiative to unite island groups (e.g., Macaronesia, the Caribbean, and others) in addressing shared challenges like resource scarcity, climate resilience, and health security. A restricted private-sector session will explore win-win public-private partnerships (PPPs) to scale solutions in wastewater surveillance, ecofactory models, and island sustainability. Organized by the Autonomous Region of Madeira and the European Commission's Joint Research Centre (JRC), the event aligns with the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), the EU's One Health strategy, and the Expo's theme of "Designing Future Society".
